PARALEGAL POSITION

The Tennessee Office of the Post-Conviction Defender (OPCD) is accepting applications for a Paralegal position. All levels of experience will be considered. **The application deadline is August 6, 2021**. Applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis.

The OPCD is an independent agency of the Tennessee state government. The agency represents people sentenced to death in Tennessee and provides non-case-specific assistance and educational resources to appointed counsel in capital cases. Direct representation focuses on the investigation and presentation of collateral claims in state courts, primarily in post-conviction proceedings. The paralegal will work on a team with attorneys and investigators to develop both guilt/innocence and sentencing claims on behalf of clients. The paralegal's primary duties will include building and maintaining a close working relationship with clients and their support system; maintaining an organized case file and database; locating, collecting, and processing records from various entities; preparing and maintaining case tracking documents; assisting attorneys with drafting and filing pleadings; performing factual research; participating in limited field investigation; handling administrative tasks related to retention of experts; as well as preparing exhibits, assisting with subpoenaing witnesses, and helping manage witnesses at court hearings.
